WORKSHOP

Endangered Archives Workshop 2010

Harriet Tubman Institute, York University, Canada

Saturday, January 23

With the explosive use of computers in recent decades, a growing number of researchers have been involved in the preservation of endangered archival documents through digital means. Accordingly, there are

researchers funded by various significant bodies currently working in Algeria, Brazil, Colombia, Cuba, Ghana, Jamaica, Nigeria, Sierra Leone and other parts of the world. The Endangered Archives Workshop will bring together researchers to discuss their digital projects and findings. The Workshop will provide a venue for participants to discuss various issues that will enable aspiring and active researchers to manage digital projects. Issues to be discussed include implementing digital standards, preparing grant applications and purchasing digital equipment and computer software. The Workshop ends with a session on website development, public outreach and publishing options available to researchers so that they may disclose their findings to various audiences.

The workshop will be held in 305 York Lanes, York University, Canada.

Museum Cleaning Basics explores everything you need to know about cleaning your collections. Participants learn when to clean--and

when not to clean. They also learn how to make those decisions. Topics range from basic housekeeping to specific techniques for specific objects. We will look at specific techniques that minimize damage while getting the work done. And we will discuss when to call in a specialist, such as a conservator. FELLOWSHIP – Deadline March 1, 2010

Mellon Fellowship in Paper Conservation at the
Philadelphia Museum of Art

The Philadelphia Museum of Art offers one Andrew W. Mellon Postgraduate Fellowship in Paper Conservation. Beginning September 1, 2010 and ending August 31, 2011, the Fellowship may be extended up to three years. Applicants should be graduates of a recognized conservation training program or have equivalent experience. The Fellow will examine, conduct research, and perform treatment on works of art on paper in the Museum collections and will be expected to participate in preservation activities throughout the Museum.

The Fellowship will focus on conservation of European and American art on paper and include work on Indian paintings, East Asian scrolls and screens, as well as minor work on photographs. The Fellow will work with the two staff paper conservators in the new

state-of-the-art laboratory which opened in spring 2007.

The fellowship includes a stipend of \$31,500.00, health insurance, \$3,000 in travel funds and \$2,000 for research support.

Applicants should send a letter with a statement of interest; a resume; transcripts of graduate and undergraduate courses; samples of examination reports and treatment records with photographic documentation, including any published treatments or research; and two supporting letters from conservation professionals familiar with the candidate's work to:

The mission of the TCF Fellowship Program is also to recognize and assist scholars, whose academic achievements and research reflect the commitment of the Turkish Cultural Foundation to disseminating knowledge about Turkey's cultural heritage.

The TCF Fellowship Program will award per year:

10 Fellowships: USD 10,000 at the Ph.D. level

5 Fellowships: USD 15,000 at the Post-doctoral level

- Recipients are selected by the Turkish Cultural Foundation. APPLICATION REQUIREMENTS
- Applicants for the TCF Fellowship must be scholars, who are pursuing a Ph.D. degree in a related field or have completed their Ph.D. or equivalent degree less than 10 years before their application.
- Candidates must be fluent in English, although the dissertations or the publications resulting from the fellowship research do not have to be in that language. Applicants are required to submit official evidence of English language proficiency.

The Met seeks a specialist in early and medieval Islamic art to fill the position of Assistant or Associate Curator in the Department of Islamic Art.

Primary Responsibilities and Specific Duties:

The Assistant/Associate Curator supports the head of the department. General duties include active participation in the management, care of, and research on the collection, as well as participation in all the activities of the Department, specifically exhibitions, publications, collection management, and planning for the new Islamic Art galleries.

Requirements and Experience:

Successful candidates must possess demonstrated experience in accomplishing original research in the field of early and medieval Islamic art. Saint John's University - Lead Cataloger, Eastern Christian Manuscript Project

The Hill Museum & Manuscript Library (HMML) at Saint John's University invites applications for a three year term position as Lead Cataloger of Eastern Christian Manuscripts. This three year term position is funded by the Andrew W. Mellon Foundation. Since 2003, HMML has digitized more than 16,000 manuscripts belonging to several Eastern Christian traditions. The Lead Cataloger will help implement HMML's international cataloging effort. In addition to original cataloging of recently-digitized collections, the Lead Cataloger will also work with off-site scholars collaborating on the project. Excellent knowledge of Syriac and Arabic is required, and knowledge of either Armenian or Ge'ez is a distinct advantage. In addition to language skills, the Lead Cataloger must have a thorough familiarity with the Christian literature in those languages, demonstrated experience of manuscript cataloging, and ease with electronic tools for research and cataloging. An earned doctorate in a relevant field is expected for this position.

A. Grants by competitive application

Senior Scholars
